On Being Catholic American An observer writes: In reflecting on what it should mean to be a "Catholic American," it is important for Catholics in America to realize that they are heirs to a two thousand year old tradition that, warts notwithstanding, can be accurately described as constituting a magnificent "triumph," a triumph that is the product of God's grace in conjunction with human effort cooperating with God's plan for mankind. Too many contemporary Catholic Americans still accept a "minority group" consciousness in this two hundred year old land once dominated by Protestants and now by secularists of one sort or another. Catholics must shed themselves of this self-effacing attitude and proudly and realistically accept the responsibility that comes from representing a tradition unsurpassed in the ability to present truth, holiness, beauty, and utility to the world. While in a potentially mutually beneficial relationship, the simple and stark fact is that the United States of America needs the Catholic worldview more than the Catholic faith requires the American experience. If this country of ours, which we love so much and which has done so much good for so many, is to escape further descent into the culture of death, it will be because of the presence, witness and actions of a revitalized Catholic Church in the United States of America.

Questions and Answers on the Cathedral Restoration

Why are there statues of pelicans in the Cathedral? The symbolism of the mother pelican feeding her young pelicans comes from a legend which said that in times of famine the mother pelican would wound herself by striking her breast with her beak in order to feed her young with her blood to keep them from starving to death. Early on Christians applied this legend to Jesus and His own self-sacrifice for our redemption: He died that we might have life. The legend also serves as an image for the Eucharist: Jesus feeds us with his own flesh blood to keep us spiritually alive.

The gospel today is clear; Peace comes to a “household if a peaceful person lives there.” Peace starts with your ability to forgive, to correct without attacking, to accept the ways of others and to recognize a different opinion is not a personal rejection. It is actually your own peace which you give to your family.

In today’s gospel the apostles were giddy with their new POWER (“Even the demons obey us!”). On this July Fourth weekend, Jesus cautions power is easily misused to dominate or manipulate others. True power is meant to “free captives,” especially those handcuffed by grief, chained to unresolved conflict, jailed inside a timid personality or imprisoned by illness.
