Pay Attention to the Spirit

The first reading in today's liturgy recounts an experience of the spirit of God being poured out on 72 elders in Israel, bringing the gift of prophecy. Since only 70 were on the official list for this gift, dissension arises when two extra men receive the spirit. This leads Moses to wish for the day when God's spirit will be poured out on all of God's people.

We believe that this wish was fulfilled in the new covenant, as the Holy Spirit has been given to all of us. All those who have been baptized have received the Spirit of God. The Spirit may not give the gift of prophecy to everyone, but each of us is called by the Spirit to serve the community with our own unique gifts. **Praise God we saw this Spirit at work in a powerful way this last weekend with our working together at the Bazaar.** May the Lord deepen such awareness in our personal lives and in our faith Community.
