**Welcoming Strangers:** *Today's readings* challenge us again to embrace the virtue of hospitality. Abraham and Sarah welcome three strangers and are rewarded with the gift of a child. In the *second reading*, the Letter to the Hebrews refers to this event: "do not neglect hospitality for through it some have unknowingly entertained angels". In the *Gospel*, Mary and Martha welcome Jesus into their home and are blessed by his presence and his teaching. Beyond hospitality offered to those who gather for worship, it would do well for us to focus today on the challenge of welcoming strangers who come to us from other countries and cultures. Hospitality is a virtue that we exercise on many levels. There are certainly external signs of hospitality that we offer to others, but hospitality is ultimately a matter of the heart. It is a stance that we take toward life and toward the people who come into our lives. Growing in openness is an essential part of growing in holiness.

**Roncalli Development Office writes:** We would like to open up our Scrip Gift Card program to a wider audience and want to promote it to the parishes. As you know the program lets people buy retail gift cards at face value, and Roncalli gets to keep a percentage of the face value. Buyers support the school without spending anymore than they already would have. To promote to the parishes, we'd like to focus on one parish for each of two weekends a little later this summer. We want to insert our order form (which will include information about the program) into the bulletins on one weekend per parish the set up a table after each Mass in the parish on the following weekend where we would take orders. We will also be stocking some inventory of cards for local retailers and will have a limited quantity on hand to sell at those tables. We are thinking of doing this on the weekends of July 24-25 and July 31-August 1.

**The New Roman Missal:** Perhaps you have followed recent publicity about upcoming changes in the Roman Missal including the texts of the Mass Ordinary (Lord have mercy, Glory to God, and Holy, Holy, Holy...) After a long period of work on its revision the Vatican is expected to officially put the new Missal into practice within the next year. The Roman Missal was *first promulgated* by Pope Paul VI in 1970 as the definitive text of the reformed Liturgy of the Second Vatican Council. A *second edition* followed in 1975. Pope John Paul II issued a revised version of the Missale Romanum during the Jubilee Year 2000. The English translation of the revised Roman missal has been completed. The revised edition of the Missale Romanum contains prayers for the observances of recently canonized saints, additional prefaces for the Eucharistic Prayers, additional Votive Masses and Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Intentions, and some updated and revised rubrics (instructions) for the celebration of the Mass. The English translation of the Roman Missal will also include updated translations of existing prayers, including some of the responses and acclamations of the people. You can view the editions of the new texts at the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops website <http://www.usccb.org/romanmissal>. It is always good to make remote preparations for what is to come, and from time to time we will try to keep you informed of developments.
