Week of Prayer for Christian Unity Although the traditional period in the northern hemisphere for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is January 18-25, the purpose behind it is to create unity throughout the entire year.

This year's theme, is an invitation from the Christians in Jerusalem to Christians worldwide to rediscover the values that made up the unity of the first Christian community in Jerusalem and to meditate on the importance of our holding to the teachings of the apostles and the common fellowship, to the breaking of the bread and prayers, elements that unite us in the only body of Christ. The churches in Jerusalem ask that we remember them in the challenge of their situation and unite in prayer in the struggle for justice, peace and prosperity of the Holy land.

Almighty and Merciful God, with great power you gathered together the first Christians in the city of Jerusalem, through the gift of the Holy Spirit, defying the earthly power of the Roman empire. Grant that, like this first church in Jerusalem, we may come together to be bold in preaching and living the good news of reconciliation and peace, wherever there is inequality and injustice. We pray in the name of Jesus Christ, who liberates us from the bondage of sin and death. Amen.

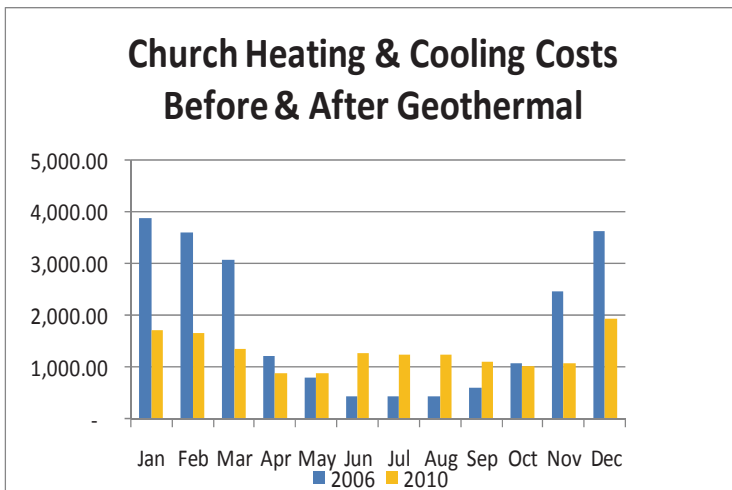

GEOHERMAL SAVINGS

The installation of geothermal in the church has been a blessing in cost savings on our heating bills and has given us the added benefit of air conditioning. The summer of 2006 costs are lower because there was no air conditioning. Also, in prior years, some monthly winter heating bills were over \$4,000.00. This graph shows the savings from 2006, the year prior to the geothermal installation and our current year. At the end of 2010 we had a 28.85% savings plus free air conditioning. If there was no air conditioning, the savings for only heat would be over 45.5%.

The rectory went on geothermal in January of 2010. This year we had over 29% savings on our heating plus much needed air conditioning for our priests.
