Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Light of the World members will be meeting this Sunday afternoon at 1:00pm for a potluck and meeting with Small groups. This process vitalizes the organization and makes for fine fellowship. We hope that all LOTW members can attend.

Fr. Zilverberg will be on Pilgrimage from January 31 – February 7th in Mexico, let us continue to pray our Novena to Our Lady of Guadalupe for God's blessing upon our parish and diocese.

This is the 36th year of observing **National Catholic Schools Week, January 30 – February 5, 2011**. The Theme and logo for Catholic Schools Week 2011 celebrate the fact that Catholic schools are an added value ("A plus") for our nation. Every day graduates from Catholic schools make positive contributions to American society. Along with high academic standards and high graduation rates, our Catholic schools build a culture of service (the A + level). "Giving back to the community" and "helping others" are values instilled in every Catholic school student.

This activism built on strong moral values develops their graduates into tomorrow's leaders. Catholic schools are given the freedom to actively teach about Jesus and his great love for us and for all people. At this particular time we are given the opportunity to insure this gift by our participation in the **Revitalizing Roncalli Campaign**. May it continue to be successful!

There will be many activities at all the Roncalli Schools this week. Among them is the **Mass that Bishop Swain will be having** at Roncalli High School this Wednesday at 1:30pm. I hope many will be able to join us.

Wednesday is also the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, once called the Purification of Mary. Both titles stem from the requirements of Jewish law that the firstborn male be presented to the Lord at the Temple and that the mother complete the days of her purification at the same time. This feast is also known as Candlemas Day, since candles are blessed today in connection with the day's theme of light. We will also bless candles for the year's use along with other candles parishioners may bring to be blessed at the 7am Mass. We will meet in the church hall for the blessing of the candles and then process into the main church

Thursday February 3 is the memorial of St. Blasé, associated with ailments of the throat. After Mass there will be the blessing of the throats for those attending.

This week we have the First Friday at 7 am., and First Saturday Anointing of the sick at the 8:15 am. The First Friday we remember the promises given to Sr. Margaret Mary Alacoque. And Saturday we remember our Blessed Mother and seek her intercession for those who may be ill or in need of healing. Jesus and Mary are the pillars on which we place our trust, for through them God's grace continues to flow to us.

Next weekend we celebrate the World Day for Consecrated Life. Soon Father Zilverberg will be taking names of the young women who may be interested in the religious life.
